THE BIG BETS FOR YEAR THREE (April 2022 – April 2023)



- Targeted recruitment of students from different regions of the city into high-quality career pathways via marketing and outreach campaign
- Establish and convene data, work-based learning, and college, career, and military preparation workgroups to advance New Skills priorities
- Dallas ISD board approval of revised district College, Career, Military Readiness strategic plan incorporating key New Skills Ready Network strategies.
- 10% increase in district-generated state College, Career, Military Readiness outcomes funding secured in 2022-2023 school year.
- Selection of feeder pattern or network to pilot middle school exploration tied to high quality pathways.
