THE BIG BETS FOR YEAR FOUR (April 2023 - April 2024)

- Leverage booming regional industry demand and existing sector partnerships to build out a one-year post secondary semiconductor certification, with direct links from a high school CTE pathway and articulation on to two- and fouryear degrees.
- Increase Columbus City Schools' student participation in work-based learning experiences in healthcare and IT by 15 percent.
- Implement a new middle school IT pathway curriculum in at least 13 middle schools.
- In response to new lottery admissions for all CTE pathways in Columbus City Schools, audit the needs of incoming students to understand supports and interventions needed for student success.
- Assess and expand construction sector pathways that span high school through a four-year degree.
- Execute a career awareness campaign for students and families to understand in-demand jobs and education and training options, including stories of student success.
- Build out a systemic and comprehensive employer engagement strategy, including how to better engage employers in work-based learning efforts at the K-12 level.
