### THE BIG BETS FOR YEAR FIVE (April 2024 – April 2025)



- Build on data and technology success by expanding Dallas ISD’s PTECH manager tool to the entire CTE department and build a centralized hub for all departments to manage relationships with industry partners.
- Foster a 20% increase in the number of UNT Dallas graduates participating in an internship.
- Increase the number of participants in the United to Learn’s Aspiring Teachers program.
- Facilitate at least 50 summer internships for Dallas ISD juniors and seniors.
- Increase the number of high school graduates with the intent to go straight to work that earn a living wage by either ensuring credentialed graduates are employed or non-credential students enroll in a program to become credentialed.

### SUSTAINABILITY ACTIONS



**Implemented:** The Commit Partnership will continue to support a coalition to advance economic mobility via related initiatives (e.g. Opportunity 2040 Fund).

**Implemented:** Plans to leverage state policy and related funding tied to positive student outcomes (e.g. HB3 and HB8) to build and sustain high-quality career pathways long-term.

**To Do:** Will increase engagement with advanced manufacturing industry partners to support meaningful pathways and work-based learning opportunities.
